Ric Curnow has been providing support and input to the research and public-facing endeavours of the Tax and Transfer Policy Institute since 2018.

Mr Curnow has decades of global media experience, in print, television and online. He has worked for a range of media organisations (CNBC, Asia Business News, EFE, AP, etc.), and as an independent journalist and service provider, has provided input and support to many more (ABC, SBS, Network Nine, Fairfax, News Ltd, BBC, CNN, etc.).

In 2012, Mr Curnow consulted to UNRWA, the UN mission in Gaza, on the establishment of an independent educational television facility, available across the Arab-speaking world.

In 2005 and 2006, Mr Curnow joined the International Foundation for Electoral Systems to support elections scheduled in the West Bank and Gaza (Palestine). During that

period he also worked with Strategic Assessments Initiative as a member of the Transitional Security Planning Team mandated to develop and oversee a reform program for the Palestinian Security Forces.

Between 1999 and 2006, Mr Curnow worked in East Timor as a UN Peacekeeper and consultant to both UN missions (UNAMET and UNTAET). In addition to managing ongoing UN television and public information initiatives, Mr Curnow provided policy input in communications, telecommunications and security to both the UN administration and the nascent government of an independent East Timor.

Mr Curnow holds an M.A. (Hons.) from the Research School of Pacific and Asian Studies, ANU, completed in 2006.
